CAN YOU PICK OUT ALL THE WORDS OF THE WEEK IN THIS ARTICLE?

The stories of the Qur'an have a significant importance in the lives of Muslims. Thus, prosaic language is often omitted from the Qur'an as Allah, the Most High, regularly opts to present believers with accounts that make the soul flutter and one's core belief pulsate. The Qur'an is divine, a unique panacea to heal hearts which are broken, a guiding light to remove the darkness of skulduggery and a criterion, separating authentic and spurious narratives.

Allah, the Exalted says,

"So, relate the chronicles (i.e. stories of previous nations) so that they may ponder..." (Qur'an 7:176).

Therefore, when studying such accounts, it is incredibly important for us to draw lessons and apply them to our own lives. It is for this reason that we have discussed many of the stories of previous prophets in our assemblies. In the story of Musa (may peace be upon him) we find the story of a brave young man who stood up to a bombastic and tyrannical ruler – a lesson for us that we should stand for justice. We spoke about Yunus (may peace be upon him) whose community quibbled with him and belied their Lord. However, just as they were about to be taken to task for their rebellion, they asked forgiveness and were pardoned – a lesson for us that it is never too late to make a change.

The stories have varied and we have endeavoured to make manifest the numerous riches which have been so covertly placed around the Qur'an. Indeed, it is only by digging and searching that one finds true gems. We pray to Allah Ta'ala that He accepts our efforts and allows us to continually benefit from His magnificent words.

Suda, a 4 year old elephant at a park in Thailand, showed off her painting skills by drawing her self portrait to entertain her visitors.


 **Taipei, Taiwan**

Year 8 - Visit Greenwich University & Morgan Stanley


As part of Eden's Leadership Day, 8D had the opportunity to visit the University of Greenwich to learn about Women in Engineering and about the university itself.
