



## Catch-Up Premium Funding Report 2017/18 and 2018/19

<b>Name of School</b>	<b>Eden Girls School, Waltham Forest</b>
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The literacy and numeracy Catch-up Premium provides schools with additional funding to support Year 7 pupils who did not achieve the national expectation in reading and/or mathematics at the end of Key Stage 2.

How much funding did the school receive in 2017/18 for catch up premium and how many pupils was this intended to support?

What were the reasons for these spending decisions?

Students joining school who are below national average, often struggle to close the gap if early and successful interventions are not well planned and effective. Intervention is a core feature of our curriculum strategy that is planned to support students to make exceptional progress.

What strategies have been used to monitor and evaluate the impact of Year 7 Catch-up premium funding?

- Monitoring of student progress each half term with personalised plans put into place to address key areas for improvement;
- Baseline reading tests and programme put into place to accelerate reading.

What difference did the use of literacy and numeracy Catch-up funding make to outcomes for Year 7 pupils supported in 2017/18?

**Reading and MATHS:**

What evidence does the school have of sustained performance of pupils who received Catch-up premium in previous years? (e.g. average progress score of low-attaining pupils in 2018, reading ages vs chronological ages of pupils who received support)

- In 2018, the Progress 8 score for different abilities was outstanding:
  - The 'Progress 8' score for 2018 is 1.28, the national average is just below 0.
  - Students with low prior attainment achieved a P8 score of around +1.9.
  - Students with middle prior attainment achieved a P8 score of around +1.2.
  - Students with a high prior attainment achieved a P8 score of around +1.3.
- In addition:
  - 42% of all students achieved the English Baccalaureate in 2018, compared to around 20% nationally.
  - In 2018, the 'Attainment 8' score, which reflects the average grade across eight academically challenging subjects, is 59.49. Nationally the A8 score is 44.3.
- In 2018, 33% achieved grades 9-5 in English and Maths, fewer than 10% achieve this nationally.
- Students make outstanding progress in literacy.
  - In 2018, 96% of students achieved a 'standard pass' (Grade 4+) and 88% achieved a 'strong pass' (Grade 5+) in English. English Progress 8 is 1.23.
- Students make outstanding progress in numeracy.
  - In 2018, 88% of students achieved a 'standard pass' (Grade 4+) and 78% achieved a 'strong pass' (Grade 5+) in Maths. Maths Progress 8 is 1.23.
